Vice-President Borja inquired on setting aside voter outreach monies, using the costs of those elections – approx. \$30k. Jeff Scott, Legal Counsel, explained that based on the election code laws, the District does not have a choice in the matter. Information outreach is an appropriate form of voter education, but the District must be cautious and practical with the matter.
