Executive Summary: Borrego Health is committed to providing and increasing access to healthcare services for those living in Desert Highland Gateway Estates and the surrounding communities. This funding will provide support for a pilot mobile services program and begin to assess the sustainability of a more permanent health care program within the community. It is anticipated that 2,913 medical and dental visits will be conducted with part time mobile services in the community.

		Due to the ever-changing situation related to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) and most recently the surge in positive cases due to the Delta Variant, dental professionals continue to be considered of increased occupational risk because of their routine exposure to patient's airways and performance of aerosol-generating procedure. Due to the confine space of mobile clinics and the risk to our dental staff, Borrego Health did not launch dental services during this reporting period. Instead, it was agreed that patients encountered during the medical mobile days would be assessed for dental related needs and referred to Borrego's nearest dental clinic, at either Centro Medico Cathedral City or DHS Health and Wellness Center depending on patient preference. Shuttle services will be provided to and from our dental clinic as needed for patients who lack transportation. Borrego Health will continue to monitor data from the Riverside County of Public Health and recommendations from the CDC and ADA to determine the best time to launch mobile dental services at DHG, the Wellness Committee and DHCD will be informed as things continue to develop.
