Coachella. Mr. Espinoza explained the pediatric vaccination clinic at Coachella Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) with ninety-eight (98) children vaccinated between the ages of 5-11 and over one hundred (100) vaccinations ages 12 and up. Upcoming events were provided, including booster shots for agricultural workers.

3. Behavioral Health Initiative – UPDATE

Jana Trew, Senior Program Officer, Public Health, provided an update on the behavioral health initiative describing the five working group meetings and their subgroups highlighting improving access to services, transportation barriers, eligibility, costs, nontraditional service hours, education and stigma reduction, cultural competency and linguistic challenges, family systems prohibitors, professional development, and workforce expansion.

Donna Craig, Chief Program
Officer, described the six recent
scholarship awards from with
them OneFuture Coachella
Valley currently gathering
information for the support
services, and will begin
distributing scholarship funds
and onboarding. The scholarship
advisory committee met and
discussed local issues, such as
relocations due to lack of job
opportunities and parents'
distrust with the school district.
The group will lead the efforts



with the school system, vision brainstorming for long-term funding for sustainability, and mentors to assist with job shadowing and other professionals.

Vice-President Borja inquired on options for loan repayment programs where the district might assist.

Dr. Bárzaga, CEO, explained strengthening the existing healthcare workforce with incentives, understanding the requirements, and stabilizing the upfront funding to allow younger students to enter health careers. Staff will consider and explore agencies, such as the California Primary Care Association (CPCA) to match funding and others related to the specific needs of and prioritizing the Coachella Valley.

Donna Craig, Chief Program
Officer, provided an update on
Borrego Health Foundation's
access to healthcare in the
Desert Highland Gateway
community for September and
their participation in the weekly
meetings of the health and
wellness committee in Desert
Highland Gateway Estates.
Pediatric patient services have
declined due to school openings
with more adults receiving care
and successfully enrolling the
uninsured in a health plan.

	insurance.
