Coachella Valley Equity Alejandro Espinoza, Chief of Collaborative Community Engagement, a. Vaccination explained the launch of the **Education and** children's vaccination event with Outreach superheroes and children activities describing the upcoming press conference in



partnership with the school districts and Riverside University Health Systems (RUHS) at the Coachella Valley Unified School District.

Conrado Bárzaga, MD, CEO, explained that the district is recruiting physicians for a live broadcast on December 15 of medical expert panelists similar to a telethon for the public to answer questions of the medical experts related to COVID.

Donna Craig, Chief Program
Officer, described the black and
African American healthcare
scholars' advisory committee
meeting, five (5) students have
received scholarship funds, and
four (4) more students are in the
interview process. Concerns still
persist that the scholarship
applicants are all female with no
males applying. A suggested
strategy to include young men of
color in the program is outreach
to the Palm Springs High School
sports medicine career pathway.

Ms. Craig explained the most recent Borrego Health Wellness Committee meeting describing an increase in vaccinations and boosters, preventive health, education on telehealth, following up with the uninsured, and testing versus vaccination-related patient visits. A new Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) funded mobile unit will be available for service at the end of the year



with the Desert Highland Gateway Estates community as one of the first communities to utilize the new unit.

The University of California Riverside (UCR) recommended a newly graduated individual in the Coachella Valley with Borrego Health extending a fulltime offer of employment for the open Community Health Worker position

4. Behavioral Health Initiative - update

Jana Trew, Senior Program
Officer, Behavioral Health,
explained that the initiative is
making progress, the working
groups are convening and
focusing on narrowing the scope
of work for specific strategy
improvements of consideration
to the steering committee.

Dr. Bárzaga, CEO, described the district's outreach to the superintendents of the school districts with the recent school shooting in Michigan for protocols to increase access and identify warning signs to prevent future occurrences of gun violence.

Donna Craig, Chief Program
Officer, explained that last year
the Regional Access Project
Foundation (RAP) issued an RFP
for a Mental Health Initiative
with the district matching the
funding in response of additional
applications received that
exceeded the funds available.
