


Desert Healthcare District Awards 5 Grants Supporting Behavioral Health Services for Children and Families

\$1,175,817 in grants approved on July 26, 2022 for behavioral health programs and services in the Coachella Valley



Coachella Valley Areas serviced by grantee organizations

<u>Desert Sands Unified School District 25%</u> (<u>students & families PD I.W, and LQ)</u>

Grant #1340 will allow DSUSD, which serves about 27,000 students, to add staff including a nurse focused on behavioral health and a behavior analyst to work with children and their families.

Martha's Village and Kitchen 8% (Valley-wide)

Grant #1336 allows the homeless shelter to focus on behavioral health awareness, education and linkage through increased training and services specific to a shelter program.

<u>Transgender Health and Wellness</u> <u>Center 11% (Valley-wide)</u>

Grant #1346 supports an opportunity for the center to expand behavioral health services for transgender residents of the Coachella Valley.

<u>Innercare, aka Clinicas De Salud Del Pueblo</u> <u>13% (Coachella, Mecca, and West Shores)</u>

Grant #1339 will fund two licensed clinical social workers, increase behavioral health services for children and families in Coachella and Mecca, and help provide telehealth services.

<u>University of California Riverside 43%</u> (<u>Valley-wide</u>)

Grant #1334 will allow the university to expand its CAREspaces on- and off-campus, which are free behavioral health services available to students and their families.
