Recommendation:

Consideration to approve Addendum #5, a cost increase from \$191,573 to \$215,000 with CONCUR, Inc. to complete an Emergency Communication Plan related to Prevention, Mitigation, and Emergency Preparedness for Airborne Environmental Hazards in the Eastern Coachella Valley (ECV).

Background:

- At November 2019 Foundation meeting, the Board approved a \$500,000 allocation from the Robert Avery Family Trust to address Airborne Environmental Hazards that impact pulmonary functions of Eastern Coachella Valley residents, to advance research and rehabilitation solutions for the ECV population.
- The Board directed staff to identify a Consultant to facilitate a stakeholder's engagement process to identify strategies to mitigate and prevent the high levels of airborne environmental hazards.
- CONCUR, Inc, is a California-based private consultancy company with significant experience and expertise addressing similar situations across the United States.
- The board approved a 12-month service agreement, NTE \$191,573, with CONCUR, Inc. executed on January 31, 2020.
- Work continues on the project with anticipated completion by March 2023.
- Staff recommends approval of Addendum #5 to the service agreement increasing the cost from \$191,573 to \$215,000.

Fiscal Impact:

- Original service agreement NTE \$191,573 Board approved allocation from the \$1M Avery Trust Funds.
- Increase cost from \$191,573 to \$215,000.

Community Health Workers (Promotoras) Recognition Event – NTE \$105,358

Staff Recommendation: Approval of a proposal NTE \$105,358 for the Coachella Valley Equity Collaborative Community Health Workers (Promotoras) Recognition and Community Engagement Event.

Background:

- DHCD's 3-year Strategic Plan calls for Proactively increase the financial resources DHCD/F can apply to support community in its Goal #1. Its Strategy 1.6 directs staff to evaluate the potential to conduct community-based fund raising. This requires a number of steps, which this proposed activity points in this direction.
- The Desert Healthcare District and Foundation has established and leads The Coachella Valley Equity Collaborative (CVEC), which has brought together community-and faith-based organizations, government agencies (county and state), and local farm owners to address the COVID-19 epidemic and ensure there is a coordinated effort to maximize resources and prevent overlap is services and/or outreach.
- The CVEC has coordinated multiple COVID-19 testing events that have been hosted throughout
 the Coachella Valle. To date, a total of 279 COVID-19 testing clinics resulting in roughly 22,306
 COVID-19 tests have been provided at events organized by the CVEC and its partners. In
 addition, more than 7,000 COVID-19 at-home tests have been provided at COVID-19 testing and
 community events.
- Since the launch of the first COVID-19 vaccine event, CVEC has hosted a total of 364 COVID-19 vaccination clinics resulting in 46,915 COVID-19 vaccines provided to District residents. In addition, a total of 465 doses of the flu vaccine have been provided since September 18 at CVEC sponsored vaccination clinics.

Information

- The success of the COVID-19 educational, testing and vaccination campaigns through the CV
 Equity Collaborative can be directly attributed to the Community Health Workers (Promotoras)
 from partner organizations, who have worked countless hours on weekends and evenings in the
 intense summer heat to ensure our District residents are connected to vital COVID-19 programs
 and services.
- Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, these Community Health Workers have put
 themselves in harm's way to ensure our District residents had access to educational, testing and
 vaccination resources putting aside their health. These unsung heroes rarely receive recognition
 or are celebrated for their unwavering commitment to improving the health and wellness of our
 District residents.
- It is with this in mind; we would like to organize a Community Health Worker Recognition Event to express our gratitude and celebrate them for their hard work during this COVID-19

pandemic and beyond.

- The event will take place April 21, 2023.
- Staff recommends approval of the proposal NTE \$105,358.

Fiscal Impact:

\$65,358 The Board has approved \$40,000 (Budget line item 5102).

Staff will work with contractor to raise these funds in sponsorships and help underwrite the event.
