Subject: Consulting Services Agreement - Probolsky Research – for a

Recommendation:

Consideration to approve a consulting services agreement with Probolsky Research to complete a public opinion study – NTE \$44,900

Background:

- The District Board is engaged in discussions of a 30-year lease renewal for Desert Regional Medical Center (DRMC).
- The proposal, submitted by Tenet, asks the District to consider a purchase option at the end of the lease in 2057.
- Ultimately, any decision of the Board related to a lease renewal or possible sale of DRMC requires a vote of the residents of the District.
- To better inform the decisions of the Board in meeting its mission to achieve optimal health at all stages of life for all District residents, the Hospital Lease Ad Hoc Committee recommends to the Board for staff to commission a public opinion study.
- The District has worked with Probolsky Research previously with the district expansion project in 2018.
- Probolsky Research does significant work in the Coachella Valley and is well
 informed of the issues surrounding the lease proposal and the impacts on the District
 and its mission.
- The study will be completed in approximately six weeks.
- The ad hoc committee recommends approval of the consulting services agreement for Probolsky Research.

CONSULTING SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") was entered into by and between Desert Healthcare District ("District"), a public agency organized and operating pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 32000 et seq., and Probolsky Research, ("Consultant") as follows:

R-E-C-I-T-A-L-S

- 1. District would like to retain the professional services of Consultant to conduct a polling of likely voters in the District regarding the Tenet lease proposal for Desert Regional Medical Center to guide the District Board in its decision making process.
- 2. Consultant has worked with the Desert Healthcare District and multiple organizations in the Coachella Valley, is qualified and possesses the knowledge, skill, and expertise, necessary to provide the professional services ("Services") as more specifically outlined in the attached Exhibit "A" ("Consultant Proposal").

C-O-V-E-N-A-N-T-S

1. CONSULTANT'S SERVICES.

- 1.1 <u>Services</u>. Consultant shall provide all labor, materials, equipment, and incidentals necessary to fully and adequately provide the District and the Desert Healthcare District ("District") with the professional services described in the Consultant Proposal. All Services shall be performed by Consultant to the reasonable satisfaction of the District.
- 1.2 <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. In performing the Services, Consultant shall, at all times comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, codes, ordinances, and orders of every kind whatsoever issued, adopted, or enacted by any federal, state, or local governmental body having jurisdiction over the Services.
- 1.3 <u>Performance Standard</u>. Consultant shall perform the Services with efficiency and diligence and shall execute the Services in accordance with the standards of Consultant's profession, generally described as that degree of skill and care ordinarily exercised by professionals providing similar services as Consultant practicing in California.
- 1.4 <u>District and Foundation's Representative</u>. For purposes of this Agreement, the District and Foundation's Representative shall be District's Interim Chief Executive Officer Chris Christensen, located at 1140 North Indian Canyon Drive, Palm Springs, CA 92262. All amendments to this Agreement shall be approved by the District Board.

2. FEES AND PAYMENTS.

- 2.1 <u>Compensation for Services</u>. For the full and satisfactory performance of the Services, District shall compensate Consultant a Not To Exceed amount of \$44,900.
- 2.2 <u>Optional Tracking Survey</u>. Should District opt to engage the services for the Optional Tracking Survey, District shall compensate Consultant a Not To Exceed amount of \$9,600.
- 2.3 <u>Invoices</u>. Consultant shall deliver monthly invoices to the District no later than the 10th day of each month for Services.
- 2.4 <u>Payment.</u> The District shall remit payment for all amounts due to Consultant within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoices; provided, however, in the event District disputes any portion of Consultant's invoice, it shall timely pay any undisputed amounts invoiced and notify Consultant within thirty (30) days of its receipt of the invoice of the specifics of any disputed amounts. The parties shall expeditiously resolve the subject of any disputed amounts by way of negotiation or, if necessary, mediation. Any such dispute shall not relieve Consultant of its obligation to continue diligently performing the Services.

3. TERM; TERMINATION.

- 3.1 <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall run from the date this Agreement is fully executed until June 30, 2024, subject to Section 1.3 above or the District's right to terminate sooner for convenience.
- 3.2 <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. District may, at any time in the exercise of its sole discretion, terminate this Agreement in whole or in part, with or without cause, by providing notice to Consultant of its intention to terminate the Agreement for convenience. So long as Consultant is not in default under this Agreement at the time of such termination, District shall pay Consultant for all Services incurred upto and including the date of termination.

4. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

District has retained Consultant to provide, and Consultant shall perform, the Services as an independent contractor maintaining exclusive direction and control over its employees; and, no personnel utilized by Consultant to perform the Services are employees of the District.

5. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS.

All deliverables and other documents generated by Consultant in the performance of the Services, including all work papers, work-in-progress, designs, documents, data,

ledgers, journals and reports prepared by Consultant as a part of Consultant's Services shall belong to and be subject to the sole ownership and use of the District. The provisions of this Paragraph 5 shall survive any termination of this Agreement.

6. INDEMNIFICATION.

Consultant agrees to indemnify and hold the District and Foundation, its governing body, officers, employees, representatives, agents, successors and assigns (collectively the District/Foundation Indemnities), harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, causes of action or costs and expenses of whatever nature or kind, incurred or suffered by the District or the District/Foundation Indeminities including indemnity claims arising by reason of any personal injury of any person or property loss, loss of use, or damage, to the extent the same arise out of or in connection with the negligent act(s) or omission(s), recklessness, or willful misconduct of Consultant, its officers, employees, subcontractors, or representatives, relating to the performance of the services outlined in this Agreement.

7. NOTICE.

All notices to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed effective upon receipt when personally served or two days after mailing by certified, return receipt requested, to the following addresses:

8. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

- 8.1 <u>Venue</u>. Venue shall lie only in the federal or state courts nearest to the City of Palm Springs, in the County of Riverside, State of California.
- 8.2 <u>Modification</u>. This Agreement may not be altered in whole or in part except by a modification, in writing, executed by all the parties to this Agreement.
- 8.3 <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement, together with all Schedules attached, contains all representations and the entire understanding between the parties with respect

to the subject matter of this Agreement. Any prior correspondence, memoranda, or agreements, whether or not such correspondence, memoranda, or agreements are in conflict with this Agreement, are intended to be replaced in total by this Agreement and its schedules.

- 8.4 <u>Assignment</u>. Consultant shall not be entitled to assign all or any portion of its rights or obligations contained in this Agreement without obtaining the prior written consent of the District. Nothing in this Agreement shall obligate the District to give such consent. Any purported assignment without the District's consent shall be void.
- 8.5 <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties and their respective purchasers, successors, heirs, and assigns.
- 8.6 <u>Unenforceable Provisions</u>. The terms, conditions, and covenants of this Agreement shall be construed whenever possible as consistent with all applicable laws and regulations. To the extent that any provision of this Agreement, as so interpreted, is held to violate any applicable law or regulation, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless be carried into full force and effect and remain enforceable.

Accessibility Standards

Our online survey platform follows the most current and best practices to ensuring accessibility for people with a diverse range of sight, hearing, movement, and cognitive abilities, including impaired users. Our online survey platform is 508 compliant (U.S. Rehabilitation Act), offering features to adhere to Section 508 including screen-reader and navigation capabilities, responsive survey layout design, accessible survey themes for the visually impaired, and accessibility testing.



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Survey Methodology

Statistically Valid Multi-mode, Multi-lingual Survey Approach


We use a multi-mode methodology, meaning that we will conduct the survey by telephone using our live U.S.-based professional interviewers and online via our secure digital platform.

This multi-mode approach maximizes the accuracy and reach of the research, increases participation rates, and minimizes response bias.

Conducting research in the language most comfortable to respondents is critical in obtaining accurate results in a statistically valid survey and is one of the best ways to alleviate language barriers. Participants can choose their preferred language at the onset of their survey experience.

For the online mode, we email or send a text message invitation and provide a secure link for the individual to access the survey online. Our online survey platform is easy to use and allows participants to complete the survey from any device: computer, tablet, or mobile phone.

After launching the online portion of the survey, we contact participants who have not already completed the survey online, on their landline and mobile phones. We place no limit on the number of completed responses via mobile phone – we match the population that uses mobile phones exclusively or prefers to respond on mobile phones in general. Below is an explanation of our reporting by survey mode.





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Sample Size

A sample size of at least 400 voters is robust and will be more than adequate to fulfill the District's goals. A sample of 400 completed interviews among voters will yield a +/-5% margin of error at a 95% level of confidence. The statistically representative, random sample will allow for statistically reliable comparisons among all subgroups of the District's population (e.g., by demographic and geographic variables).



Sample Stratification

The statistically valid sample file of Desert Healthcare District voters will be secured by Probolsky Research, at our expense, from the County of Riverside Registrar of Voters that includes addresses, emails, and phone numbers – (landlines and mobile phones) and is inclusive of all voters, both demographically and geographically.

<u>Unique to Probolsky Research</u>: **We match the demographics of Desert Healthcare District voters.** This means we capture <u>real responses</u> of the right number of each gender, age group, ethnicity, party, District Zone, etc.

Data Analysis

We complete comprehensive statistical analyses of the research results, utilizing software programs, including IBM SPSS and R to conduct deep statistical testing, such as multiple regression analysis. Both qualitative and quantitative data will be analyzed in a scientifically valid manner. This helps us discover and present statistically significant results – beyond the broad opinions – and understand the specific factors that contribute to attitudes and beliefs of voters. Such analyses are crucial in identifying gaps in public perception and awareness. Once we have run all analyses on results, cross tabulations are developed, graphics are generated, and other elements of the report are prepared.



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
Reporting

Our reporting is comprehensive and immediately usable by decision makers. Our reporting includes:

- 1. Draft survey summary findings in PowerPoint presentation format focused on actionable and usable data results, graphics, benchmarking data and crosstabulations
- 2. Report on results, including survey background and results, methodological description, questionnaire results, survey top lines (displaying the aggregate percentages of responses to each question), cross-tabulations based on key demographic information, open-ended question responses with demographic overlay, analysis, conclusions, and recommendations
- 3. Results sent via PDF and hard copy (if requested)

- 5. In-person meetings, presentations, conference calls, and ongoing consulting

Geospatial Mapping

Geospatial mapping of results is included. We will map survey respondents and their responses to different questions geographically. <u>Our method ensures that individual respondents cannot be identified.</u>

Background:

- At the December 6, 2024 Board of Director's meeting, staff was directed to engage the services of a consultant to advise the Board on the process and costs of assuming operational responsibility of DRMC in the event the Tenet lease is not extended.
- Staff has been working with the District's legal counsel and hospital lease consultant to identify qualified consultants for this project.
- Meetings are scheduled in the next two weeks to determine the best consultant suited for the project and to recommend a consulting services agreement to the Board for consideration of approval in February.

Fiscal Impact:

Presently unknown
