Subject: Purple Binder Administration and Maintenance Agreement

**Staff Recommendation**: Approve the annual administration and maintenance contract with Purple Binder, Inc. in the amount of \$43,000 for the period May 15, 2017 to May 14, 2018. At the F&A Committee Meeting on May 9, 2017, the agreement was reviewed and recommended forwarding to the Board for approval.

**Background:** DHCF entered into a contract with Purple Binder, Inc. on October 10, 2014, for a period of 18 months to provide the initial 6-monthset-up of a community resource directory for the Coachella Valley (cvHIP) and to provide a further 12 month term of service for deployment. The total contract was for \$153,158. The annual contract is to provide the necessary support by Purple Binder to host, administer, update, and provide all technical support for the continued Coachella Valley specific on-line health and wellness resource tool branded as cvHIP. This is year 2 of the maintenance contract

**Discussion:** At the DHCD Board meeting in November 2013, the Board voted to support the development of a comprehensive community health portal through its partnership with Mayor Pougnet. The collective fund, administered by the DHCF, is restricted to the development and implementation of a community health portal.

- ./ Established on 11/21/2013 with 50% of the funds matched from the 2013 Mayor's Race.
- ./ DHCD Board committed an additional \$100,000 each year for the next two years of future DHCD match to the portal.
- ./ YTD Collective Fund Total = \$500,000
- ./ YTD Committed Costs for Development of Phase 1 (cvHIP) = \$ 214,013
- ./ Balance = \$285,987
